



Bachelor of Social Sciences (Government and Laws) and Bachelor of Laws

Jointly offered by the Department of Politics and Public Administration and the Faculty of Law, the 5-year curriculum enables students to study two programmes and be awarded two degrees upon completion. The curriculum consists of a combination of Social Sciences and Law courses.

Satisfactory completion of five years leads to the award of the degrees of Bachelor of Social Sciences (Government and Laws) and Bachelor of Laws (LLB). Students may also opt out at the end of the second year to exit with only a Bachelor of Social Sciences (Government and Laws) upon completion of the fourth year of study. The study of the fifth year for the two degrees is on a self-funded basis and the tuition fee is set at a higher level.
