Tips from Job Seekers and Employers

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Fewer students are coming to campus in business attire these days. Most of them have been attending interviews but how many have actually secured a job offer? What advice do they have for finding employment? What do employers look for? What methods do they use to assess candidates?

The first group of employers who has already signed up our students is what is commonly known as the "Big Four" Audit Firms. They are PricewaterhouseCoopers, KPMG, Ernst and Young and Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu. Following close behind are PCCW, McKinsey, Monitor, Development Bank of Singapore, Standard Chartered Bank, Barclays Capital, Morgan Stanley, Goldman Sachs, HSBC, Hong Kong Disneyland, Jardine Aviation etc.

Overall, our recruitment figures are 72% higher than the same time last year. Paul Yip, Pamela Chan and Kanne Leung are just three of our students who have already received job offers. Their advice to students is:

- "Set a clear goal! Then go for it!"
- "Whatever you want to do, do it with all your heart."
- "Preparation is the key to a successful job search!"

Paul has signed up with a prominent management consulting firm. In his view, his job search success resulted from:


- · A clear career goal

Paul has these suggestions for fellow students:

- First and foremost, set clear and achievable goals.
- Take one step at a time to find jobs.
- Conduct plenty of research and gain thorough knowledge of the companies and the industry you wish to pursue.
- Write an error-free CV and cover letter; it is a crucial make or break matter. Ask for comments on your CV and cover letter from people around you.
- Don't hesitate to ask for assistance.

 Active participation in summer internship programme - she spent the entire summer of 2003 doing basic operational duties in Disney World, Florida, USA as an intern. She performed a memorised spiel on stage, monitored guest safety, attended to guests at the attractions and sold souvenirs. She put her heart into it, performing the role of a gracious and cheerful hostess and volunteering for additional and unpopular duties. Pamela believes in putting her heart into whatever she is doing and was consistently rated by her supervisors as "Outstanding". She left Walt Disney with an excellent reference letter.

What contributed to Pamela's success?

- The strong drive to self-enhancement Pamela felt that she was not as proficient in Chinese as in English. Therefore she practiced writing in Chinese and approached professors in the Chinese Department for comments on her work.
- Support and assistance from the University CePc's CV critique service, and interview practice with the staff of the Faculty of Business and Economics, are two examples.

"Don't send mass mail to employers. Get focused on your job search. Research on your target employers and write a tailor-made cover letter and CV. Don't hesitate to ask for help."

 Participate in activities outside your intended professionhe got involved in extra-curricular activities outside law and joined AIESEC as a Communications Officer to develop himself.

- Prepare a well-written CV he sent his CV to the CePc for comments and feedback.
- Develop good employer knowledge before making any application, he would browse the employer's website and either attend the recruitment talk or watch the recording of the talk on the CePc website.
- Gain alumni support he also approached alumni for career advice and interview practice

In conclusion, Kanne wishes to say to students:

"Prepare as much as you can before starting your job search. Good preparation will help build your self-confidence, and help you to meet the challenges ahead!"

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
