Graduate Employment Survey 2020 Bachelor's Degrees

I. Summary

- 1. Full employment was achieved among Bachelor's Degree graduates for the fifteenth consecutive year. For graduates who sought employment, the employment rate was high at 98.7%*.
- 2. Graduates entering Education sector had increased by 3.5 p.p. while those joining Commerce & Industry had decreased by 3.6 p.p.
- 3. Average monthly gross salary had increased by 2.9%, and median monthly gross salary had gone up by 4.1%.
- 4. Community, Social & Personal Services sector registered an increase of 8.8% in average gross salary, whereas a salary drop of 7.1% was recorded in Civil Service sector.
- 5. Within Commerce & Industry, the greatest salary increase was found in Agriculture & Fishery where graduates were mainly employed for product and marketing related work.

II. Survey Methodology

The survey was conducted in the form of questionnaires to all 3,662 full-time graduates. A total of 3,219 graduates replied, representing a response rate of 87.9%.

III. Key Findings

- 1. Among all the survey respondents, 75.1% were employed and 21.3% decided to pursue further studies. The percentage of graduates pursuing further studies had increased from 17.6% in 2019 to 21.3% in 2020 (+3.7 p.p.), while those being employed had decreased from 79.5% to 75.1% (-4.4 p.p.).
- Commerce & Industry continued to be the largest employment sector (50.3%) despite a drop of 3.6 p.p. comparing to 2019, followed by Community, Social & Personal Services (21.3%). More graduates were employed in Education (15.4%) in 2020, up 3.5 p.p..

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- 3. The average and median monthly gross salary had increased steadily by 2.9% (from \$27,175 to \$27,956) and 4.1% (from \$21,125 to \$22,000) respectively.
- 4. A significant rise of 8.8% in average monthly salary (from \$35,708 to \$38,868) was recorded in Community, Social & Personal Services sector, while that in Civil Service had declined by 7.1% (from \$37,516 to \$34,869).
- 5. In the commercial sector, the three industries that experienced the highest salary hikes were Agriculture & Fishery (+17.4%), Hospitality & Tourism Services (+10.7%) and Financial Institutions (+7.4%). On a closer look, graduates working in Agriculture & Fishery took up product or marketing jobs in general, same for those in the Hospitality & Tourism Services industry.
- 6. 33.8% of the employed graduates entered the gross monthly income group of \$30,000 or more, up 1.8 p.p.. More graduates reported a salary of \$10,000 to \$14,999 (+1.7 p.p.) while fewer were in the income groups of \$20,000 to \$24,999 (-1.8 p.p.) and \$15,000 to \$19,999 (-1.6 p.p.).
- 7. With a slight delay in general, less than half of the graduates (46.9%) received their first job offer before end of June 2020 (-9.6 p.p.). 83.1% of them secured an offer before end of September (-6.6 p.p.).
- 8. 83.0% of graduates were either satisfied or very satisfied with their jobs. The vast majority of graduates (91.3%) did not change job since graduation. The percentage of graduates changing jobs (8.7%) had decreased comparing to 2019 (-2.6 p.p.).
- 9. Among non-local graduates, 58.2% of them engaged in employment after graduation, down 7.1 p.p. comparing to last year. For the 32.6% of graduates who chose to pursue further studies, most had taken Hong Kong (37.1%) or the USA (23.5%) as their destinations regardless of the small declines respectively, whereas more graduates decided to further study in Australia (+4.2 p.p.) and the United Kingdom (+2.3 p.p.).
- 10. A majority of non-local graduates landed their jobs in Hong Kong (68.8%) despite a drop of 7.4 p.p.. The percentage of those working in Mainland China (11.8%) and other Asian countries (14.5%) had increased by 5.2 p.p. and 1.8 p.p. respectively.
