Bachelor of Arts in Landscape Studies**

The Bachelor of Arts in Landscape Studies [BA(LS)] is an internationally recognised undergraduate degree offered by HKU's Division of Landscape Architecture. The programme delivers a studio-based, interdisciplinary education at the intersection of landscape architecture, ecology, geography, civil engineering, conservation, and professional design and planning practice. Students enter BA(LS) from diverse academic backgrounds, including both the arts and science streams, and learn to connect creative speculation with environmental knowledge, technical skill, public communication, and ethical responsibility.

At HKU, landscape is taught as a way to understand the technical, cultural, and political dimensions of environmental change across development sectors. Landscape architecture is an increasingly important discipline because the major challenges facing cities and regions today, including rapid urbanisation, climate change, resource depletion, biodiversity loss, rising sea levels, environmental risk, and social inequality, cannot be addressed through policy, planning, engineering, or design alone. Sustainable change requires sustained engagement with the communities, ecologies, infrastructures, and histories that shape places over time.

The BA(LS) education centres on the design studio, an intensely creative and collaborative learning environment where you work one-on-one with your instructors to develop research and design strategies for real-world problems. As a landscape student, you progress through six studios addressing urban parks, high-density cities, rural landscapes, infrastructure, remediation, ecological restoration, and regional landscape planning. These studios build your strengths in creative problem solving, critical thinking, public communication, and research methodologies. You will become adept at geospatial analysis, confident with digital tools and fabrication processes, and experts in a range of graphic media. Outside of the design studio, you will take courses in landscape technology, plants and ecology, and environmental history and theory. Fieldwork, site visits, and experiential learning across Hong Kong and internationally are integral to the programme, allowing you to encounter first-hand the diverse ecologies, communities, and processes that shape our high-density city and sustain our environment.

Graduates of the BA(LS) programme may continue into the professionally accredited Master of Landscape Architecture programme at HKU or pursue postgraduate study in landscape architecture, urbanism, planning, environmental design, conservation, and related fields internationally. Whether engaging with a corporate client, informing a public body, collaborating with communities, or joining an environmental non-profit, BA(LS) students develop the critical, creative, and technical capacity to advocate for just and sustainable change.
