

What is **Academic Advising?**

At HKU, academic advising involves helping students to understand the aims of University education, the culture and ethos of learning, the available educational options, and the paths that could be taken so that students can draw their own roadmaps to achieve their goals and monitor their own progress. Academic advising should result in students' greater satisfaction with their academic experience, better self-understanding, and a sense of success in the achievement of personal and academic goals.

University-based Academic Advising

The Academic Advising and Scholarships Office (AASO) staffed by an academic adviser and experienced administrators is set up to co-ordinate academic advising initiatives and training across Faculties and to assist students in understanding the University requirements, course enrolment procedures, and academic options. In addition, the Scholarships Team of the AASO serves as a one-stop platform to help administer merit-based scholarships, promote scholarship opportunities to students and liaise with external and internal parties. Faculty-based Academic Advising

Faculty Student Adviser

Faculty Student Adviser (FSA) is assigned to each new undergraduate student to assist them in adjusting to the university studies as well as the registration and course enrolment process. FSA also provides new students with support on the academic transition to the university and share successful study strategies.

Faculty Academic Adviser

Students can select a Faculty Academic Adviser (FAA) online through SIS in mid-August, based on their discipline and intended majors. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with their FAA at least once per semester during the first year to discuss various academic issues and their learning experience. The Programme Coordinator of each Major and Minor programme will provide specific academic advice about the programme concerned for students in Year II or above. The contact details of the FAA are available in the SIS system (via HKU Portal) from mid-August.
